


Camera Technique

Medium Shot (MS)


Close Up (CU)

Shooting in sequence means to think like an editor.



Camera Movement

Energizing Your Shots

Tilt Pan Zoom in/out Tracking/Dolly Tripod/Handheld











Movements <u>must</u> be deliberate!

Think beginning, middle and end.

Tip: count to 6 while panning or tilting to achieve an ideal duration for the movement.
